Pambula supermarket

The public exhibition period for a proposed supermarket development at Pambula has been extended for 30 days until Friday 8 January 2016. The extension is in response to requests by Pambula residents for additional time to consider the proposal. The application and related plans can be inspected at Council's Zingel Place, Bega, office from 9am to 4pm, Monday to Friday, and Eden library from 9.30am to 4pm (closed Monday) or on our website.

Weed inspectors in Cobargo

Council's weeds officers are inspecting the Cobargo area for the invasive weed African Lovegrass during December. We are attempting to keep the northern parts of the Shire free of the weed as there are only isolated scatterings on individual properties and roadsides. Pupils plant at Kisses Lagoon

Two classes from Bega Valley Public School have been helping with the regeneration of Kisses Lagoon. The Year 6 pupils and their Kindergarten buddies walked to the western side of the lagoon where they planted grasses, shrubs and trees in the space where willows once grew.

The planting was another element of Bega Valley Shire Council's Bringing NRM to Town – Bega Urban Floodplain Wetlands Restoration Project, which is funded through the Environmental Trust.

The students planted 540 new plants as part of the regeneration of this very visible Bega landmark.

Plans to upgrade sports complexes

Draft master plans for Bega Sporting Complex (including Valley Fields) and Pambula Sporting Complex are on public display for comment and feedback and Council hopes sportsground committees, sporting clubs and the broader community will take the time to look over the plans and express their opinions.

The master plans will establish how the sites should look and function by providing a clear framework and direction for staged ongoing improvements and, as they are public assets, we see constructive community feedback as essential to meeting community needs and expectations.

The Bega plan includes an expanded indoor centre complete with seating and viewing areas, change rooms, and kiosks that can service both fields. At Pambula the plan proposes development of the southern area of the site to formalise the equestrian space and include stables as well as establishing two playing fields and a new pavilion to service this area.

There will be public workshops to talk about the draft plans and answer questions next week – at the Pambula Sporting Complex at 5.30pm Wednesday 9 December; and at Bega Council offices at 5.30pm Thursday 10 December to address the Bega Recreation Grounds and Valley Fields plan.

Our Halls, Tathra

Work began on Tathra Hall in early 1913, when land was selected for the hall site with foundation laid by people from Bega, Tathra and Bega River Sawmill in July.

Once complete, the hall opened in November 1913 with a grand ball considered a great success – even though it rained.

Tathra Hall has hosted vaudevilles, dances, Cinderellas (dances for children dressing up in fairy tale outfits), public lectures, card nights, weddings, anniversaries, birthdays, concerts, yoga, aerobics, childcare and a polling place to vote.

Over the years the hall has had some renovations, including some remodelling in the 1930s, the addition of a brick veneer façade in the 1980s and toilets added in the 1990s.

The Tathra Lions Club did the 2010 renovation of the hall which removed the brick veneer façade to return the hall to its original look.

The Sunshine Club bought the stove, fridge and crockery to upgrade the kitchen and the solar panels on the roof are courtesy of the Tathra Mountain Bike Club and Clean Energy for Eternity, both added in 2013.

Today the hall has toilets, a 200 person capacity, disability access, 100 chairs and six benches, heating, hot water and an updated kitchen facility.
