1 Welcome and apologies

Welcome to our newest member of the Access and Inclusion Advisory Committee (AIAC), Mr James Aulbury.

2 Confirmation of minutes

That the minutes of the previous AIAC meeting held on 9 November 2021 be taken as read. Motion moved by Rosemary Oates and seconded by Felicity Gates. Unanimously adopted.

3 Election of Chair and Deputy Chair

The AIAC unanimously resolved that Rosemary Oates be appointed Chair and Felicity Gates be appointed Deputy Chair.

4 Presentations to the Committee

4.1 Discussion on access and inclusion improvement opportunities, including review of Blackfellows Lake project and roles and responsibilities of AIAC.

Dr Alice Howe addressed the Committee with the opportunity to discuss the potential process improvements in the access and inclusion realm.

Dr Howe met with outgoing members, Mr Ron Finneran (OAM) and Mr Chris Sparks who conveyed their feedback around the current business processes. Key elements of feedback included:

- Understand competing priorities
- Positive culture of organisation
- Time to retire from the AIAC
- Improve communication with project reference group members
- More time at the design stage, prior to seeking grant funding
- · Include accessibility in contractor briefings
- Increase engagement with business sector, especially tourism

In addition to this, Dr Howe met with internal BVSC staff who discussed the following feedback:

- There has been a breakdown in communication on some projects
- Competing expectations of stakeholders
- Designs sometimes not well developed at grant application stage
- Changes due to budget and/or site constraints not always communicated to stakeholders
- Project managers could be better supported (within Council) through consultation process

Dr Howe discussed the Section 355 Access and Inclusion Advisory Committee Guidelines and requested feedback on whether any changes were required as part of the next renewal (after 4 September).

The following opportunities for improvement were noted by Dr Howe:

- Improve stakeholder analysis (have all stakeholders been identified?)
- Focus Project Reference Group composition on key stakeholders
- Clear documentation of commitments
- Develop tools to assist project managers
 - Multi-criteria analysis to assist with design priorities
 - Checklist to guide community engagement
 - Contractor pre-tender and kick off briefing guides
- Refresher training for project managers
- · Increase resourcing for design and engagement to improve grant applications
- Review AIAC Guidelines for next term

Feedback from the Committee included:

- Cr Bain added that the Committee composition should consider groups wider than the current groups to include mothers with prams and the nursing home sector.
- Ms Jenny Robb commented that quite often it's a long time between the project concept, grant funding and project initiation and execution so initial quotations often don't consider changes in prices and delivery. Mr Ian Macfarlane added that in the past, often there is not enough time to reconsider accessibility issues when the project completion is pressing.
- Mr Grady added that there is a 'juggling act' between levels of design in concept and level
 of commitment before we get the committee involved in consultation. He added that
 most projects are asset renewals and are designed based from the Building Code of
 Australia for specifications.

- Mr Macfarlane added that there are a lot of community led/driven projects that are approved in principle by Council and executed by community groups (Community Project Proposals). Further education for community members would be beneficial to overall design concepts.
- Cr Bain added that a member of the AIAC should be part of each Section355 Committee of Council to allow cross-fertilisation of knowledge.

New Action: Review the Access and Inclusion Advisory Committee Guidelines at the May 2021 meeting.

New Action: Committee members to provide feedback on Guidelines ahead of the next AIAC meeting. Consider promotion of accessibility more generally, staff and community group training.

6.4 Other Business

6.4.1 Proposed changes to grant management (Alice Howe)

Dr Howe briefed the group on the potential changes to the grants process in Council. A report is going to the 10 March 2021 Council meeting and will go on public exhibition thereafter.

Main changes to the program include:

- Provide non-competitive allocation for significant annual community events (NAIDOC, ANZAC Day Australia Day)
- Standardise governance framework, with determinations made by new S355 Grant Committees of Council on recommendations by SME panels.
- Annual review of grant funding priorities and guidelines
- Release one round with multiple grant streams each year (release February, close April, award June, for expenditure the following year).
- Community groups will be able to apply for multiple year grants rather than having to apply for the same grants each year.
- Develop and apply template for post-grant evaluation
- There will be sub-committees of Council to assess the grants rather than having to send each grant submission to the full Council.

Key benefits to this change include:

• Supporting community groups and organisations to deliver outcomes for the community

- Supports volunteerism
- Enables innovation in community events and programs

Action: Secretariat to send the exhibition information around to Committee following Council determination.

6.4.2 Proposed Merimbula Chamber of Commerce Summit for 19-20 February (Rosemary Oates)

Ms Oates addressed the Committee about the Merimbula Town Summit scheduled for Friday 19 and Saturday 20 February 2021. The Summit is a face-to-face and online forum with the aim to promote a stronger, aligned community face for rebuilding and achieving implemental action. It is an opportunity to reflect on future projects, address issues for improvement in the town centre. Ms Oates suggested that anyone who was willing, should register to attend.
