'Try Out' the Aquatic Centre

It will be 'Try it Out' day at the Sapphire Aquatic Centre on Saturday 18 April with all funds raised going to Multiple Sclerosis research.

The day will highlight the various services and programs offered by the Centre and at the same time raise money towards finding a cure for a chronic, disabling disease of the central nervous system.

The core event on the day will involve teams of three to six swimmers taking the challenge of completing one, two or four hour non-stop swims.

There will be lots of other activities for children throughout the day, including a jumping castle, balloon craft, pool inflatable and flipper ball.

For parents interested in seeing if the Learn to Swim program is suitable for their children there will be five-minute free private lessons as well as stroke correction tutorials.

The child minding room will also be open.

Entry to the Sapphire Aquatic Centre on the day will be free but a small donation will be required to participate in activities as a way to raise funds for MS Research Australia.

Registrations for the charity swimming event are open now and will close on Thursday 16 April.

This weekend a small group will be pre-drilling the steel posts which have been purchased for the project.

In coming weeks, members will work with Council and contractors to remove the next section of old fence, dig post holes and put the new poles in place. Watch this space!

Club Grants applications open

Community organisations throughout the Shire are being encouraged to lodge applications for the latest round of Club Grants.

Council is co-ordinating the process

and encouraging interested community and not-for-profit groups to get in early with their applications.

The Club Grants are incredibly popular, with last year's grants program providing more than \$92,000 in support of 53 projects that benefited the local community.

Council is convening the Category 1 Club Grants which cater for local community priorities such as welfare and social services, development projects, local health services and employment assistance activities.

The scheme is funded by the Bermagui Country Club, Club Bega, Club Sapphire Merimbula, Eden Fishermen's Recreation Club, Merimbula RSL, Pambula Merimbula Golf Club and Tura Beach Country Club.

Successful projects for 2015 will be allocated according to the Club Grants Committee's funding priorities, which include projects that assist the Aboriginal community, children, young people, seniors, women, people with disabilities and people from non-English speaking backgrounds.
