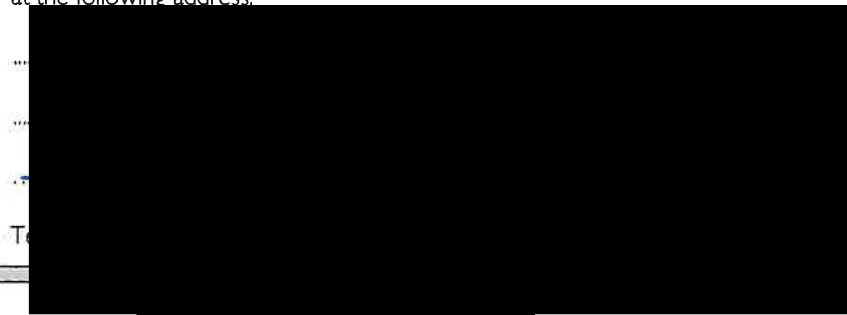

1.3 Description of Event

The race is an endurance mountain bike race largely conducted on off road single track, gravel roads and fire trails on land north and south of Tathra including land owned by the Bega Local Aboriginal Land Council, Private Property, Crown Land, and Mimosa Rocks National Park. The purpose of the event is to further cement Tathra as a significant mountain bike tourism destination and to raise funds for community groups.

Some races will be conducted on the weekend on the Bundadung land and land leased by Tathra Country Club. Those races do not use or cross public roads.

Mapping details

All references in this document are references to the Bega 1:25000 mapsheet 8824 1S and to the Wolumla 1:25000 mapsheet 8824 2N. All names of roads and tracks are derived from those mapsheets.

1 Risk Management

2.1 General Safety Precautions

1. A detailed briefing document will be incorporated in the Conditions of Entry provided to all riders prior to the event and placed on the Event website.
2. Minimum age of participants is 12 years at the time of the event.
3. Communications between Traffic Management Personnel and TMP Co ordinator be maintained at all times throughout the event by UHF radio, mobile phone and where necessary by satellite mobile phone.
4. A safety briefing will be included in materials provided to each rider before the commencement of the ride and placed on the Event website. Riders will be warned of the narrow roads and the need to be mindful of passing motorists, and to obey all road rules.
5. All riders will be advised to carry a mobile phone and reminded of the emergency numbers 000 and 112.
6. Riders will also receive the above briefing as part of the Conditions of Entry.
7. Riders will be requested to ride on left hand side of the road possible. Car drivers will be encounter warning signs advising of cyclists ahead or warning of cyclists crossing as appropriate. Riders will encounter warning signs advising of road crossings ahead or other warnings of traffic conditions as appropriate. See Traffic Control Plan. Residents of Bay Drive Mogareeka will be letterboxed to advise of the event.
8. Traffic control will be in place to enable riders to turn right as a peloton from the Tathra Bermagui Road to Bay Drive Mogareeka, as a peloton. Traffic could be delayed for two to three minutes by qualified controllers, on three occasions. See relevant Traffic Control Diagram.

9. It is expected that riders will spread out over a large distance as the races progress so apart from Paragraph 8 above, car drivers should only encounter single riders or very small groups at any point in time.
10. Entries for the 2021 event will be capped at 500 riders.
11. Roads to be signposted as per the attached Traffic Control Plan.
12. UHF Radios and mobile phones as appropriate to be placed with volunteer marshals.

2.3 Emergency Plan

- Ambulance and Hospital will have prior notice of the Event.
- All volunteer marshals will be given list of emergency contacts via mobile, satellite mobile and UHF radio as appropriate.
- Sweep riders will follow competitors with radios and First Aid kits.
- The event manager is to be contacted immediately in the event of any emergency during the event. They will ensure that Police, ambulance or hospital are contacted as required.
- Two medical practitioners will be on site for the race.
- Races will be cancelled if appropriate. Advice to be obtained from NPWS and or RFS as appropriate.

- See document “Emergency Response Plan for Tathra Mountain Bike Enduro”.

Rest stops

- Provide water and food supplies to riders at rest stops. Rest stops will be placed at approximately 25 to 30 km .
- Provide limited assistance to riders if needed.
- Should the ride need to be cancelled, arrangements will be made with support vehicles to stop riders and facilitate return to Tathra.
- Decision will be made on the morning of the race as to whether conditions are safe.

TRAFFIC Control Plan

The Traffic Control plan sets out details of the signage to be used and is drawn from the *RTA Guidelines for Bicycle Road Races 1 January 2004*.

SUMMARY OF PRINCIPLES

1. Riders will start at the Country Club and proceed by via Andy Poole Drive to Mogareeka. Andy Poole Drive in each direction will be a transport (non-race) stage. Riders will be instructed to ride in accordance with all road rules and no more than 2 abreast for this section. Any rider not complying with the conditions of a transport stage may be penalised or disqualified. This ensures that no rider will be enthusiastically racing on this section at such an early stage of the Event.

Riders will NOT be using the multi purpose track from the Country Club to the Bridge.

The Traffic Control Plan envisages to brief stoppages of traffic proceeding downhill in Mogareeka to allow the peloton to cross as a group into Bay Drive. Traffic will be stopped for not more than 3 minutes on two occasions. This is a safety consideration to allow the riders to turn right into Bay Drive safely.

Riders will proceed via Ford's Farm and then return via the Tathra Bermagui Road and Andy Poole Drive to the Country Club before continuing the balance of the various race courses.

Andy Poole Drive in each direction will be a transport (non-race) stage. Riders will be instructed to ride in accordance with all road rules and no more than 2 abreast for this section. Any rider not complying with the conditions of a transport stage may be penalised or disqualified. This ensures that no rider

will be enthusiastically racing on this section at such an early stage of the Event.

From the Country Club all riders will proceed on tracks immediately behind the Treatment Works to the land owned by the Bega Local Aboriginal Land Council. Ultimately they will arrive by way of singletracks and fire trails at a point inside the 50kph speed sign on the Tathra Bega Road opposite the Tathra RFS shed. The riders will not cross the Bega Tathra Road to the Tathra Rural Fire Shed this year. Instead they will return to the Country Club via the reminder of the trails between this point and the Tathra Beach County Club.

The 75km riders will undertake a further lap of the Bundadung side.

All other races will be entirely within the Bundadung area. No roads will be involved for those races.

Tathra Mountain Bike Enduro - Event summary and Statement of Environmental Effects.

Overview of the Event

The Tathra Mountain Bike Enduro has run each year for the last nine years and has generated considerable funds for capital improvements and donations to local community groups. In particular, funds from the Enduro have enabled Clean Energy for Eternity to provide solar panel installations for every community building in Tathra and to the Bega Local Aboriginal Land Council in Bega. The bulk of community funds for the Tathra Community Solar Farm were generated by the last few Enduros and enabled its completion ahead of time.

Many of the tracks are located on Aboriginal Land. The Local Aboriginal Land Council has been involved in their development and construction. The Club continues to provide mountain biking programs to encourage kids to take up mountain biking through its Dirt Groms program..

The Event consists of a series of mountain bike races starting and finishing at the Tathra Country Club. The races all use off road tracks and generally avoid the use of public roads.

The Event has helped place Tathra on the map as a mountain biking destination and is strongly supported by the Tathra Chamber of Commerce. The Event brings up to 500 cycling tourists to Tathra on an otherwise quiet weekend. Many of those cyclists have become repeat visitors at other times, particularly in the cooler months when mountain biking in places such as Canberra is less pleasant.

Activities

The races involve various distances from as short as 1 kilometre for the youngest children's race through 20 kilometre, 50 kilometre and 100 kilometre for the elite riders. In addition, local musicians provide on track entertainment to encourage riders as they tackle hills. Some of the musicians provide entertainment at the Country Club Event Hub after in conjunction with the presentation of prizes.

Food for competitors has been provided by local businesses and organisations such as the Tathra Lions Club.

How the Event is Run – Management

The Event is run under the Event Management Guidelines established by The Mountain Bike Association of Australia. ("MTBA"). The Club's Insurance policy providing indemnity of up to \$20 million is provided through MTBA.

In addition, any use of public roads is reviewed by the local Traffic Committee and is covered by a formal Traffic Management and Control Plan prepared by an appropriately qualified person.

All land owners involved have consented to the Event and are appropriately indemnified under the Club's insurance.

Qualified First Aiders follow the riders in each race and two doctors are stationed at the Event Hub with a First Aid room.

The local Rural Fire Service Brigade assists the Club with the running of the Event.

What to Expect on the weekend

In order to keep the Event manageable, the Club has set a limit to date of 500 riders for the Event. We have never had that number and don't expect to in the future. A total of Approximately 250 riders are expected in the 50 kilometre and 100kilometre races which run concurrently. In addition up to 50 riders might participate in the easier 20 kilometre race and we expect approximately 50 to 60 children to participate in the various children's races.

Car Parking is provided at the Country Club and adjacent to the Sewerage Works. Riders and Spectators are encouraged to ride from their accommodation to the Country Club to minimise the need for parking.

Spectator Points are adjacent to the Thompsons Road / Old Tip Road intersection and at the Fire Shed.

Saturday

The Event Hub is set up with timing equipment, sponsor's banners, registration for riders and bunting to direct riders on the Saturday morning. Children's races commence at approximately 2pm on the Saturday afternoon.

Late on the Saturday afternoon the various warning signs are placed in accordance with the Traffic Management Plan requirements.

Sunday.

Riders in the King Nelba 75k Race start at approximately 8-00 am after a rider briefing. They proceed to Andy Poole Drive and ride to Mimosa Rocks National Park under traffic management. They then return to the Country Club and enter various single tracks in the Bundadung area. This year the riders will not be crossing the Bega Tathra Road over to the Tathra Fire Shed side of the trails. The riders will

complete a majority the tracks within the Bundadung area and return to the Country Club. They then do a second lap (without the ride to Mogareeka and Fords Farm).

Immediately before the start of the 50k race, a local Aboriginal Elder has in the past performed a Welcome to Country Ceremony. Hopefully that will continue.

The riders in the 50 kilometre race simply do the first lap of the 100 k route above.

The impact on motorists is minimised. There may be a short delay of a few minutes for motorists as riders proceed in a group on the road from the Country Club to Bay Drive Mogareeka.

Drink Stations and other marshalling assistance are provided by local community groups such as the PreSchool, churches and the Surf Club. The Event is a whole of community Event.

Various cut off times are specified so that all riders should have returned to the Country Club by 2pm at which point Presentation of Prizes and Awards is undertaken.

Most riders will have departed from the Country Club by 3-30pm and the Event Hub is dismantled entirely by 5 pm.

Environmental Impact

The Tathra Mountain Bike Club's tracks have all been built in accordance with the Standards developed by the International Mountain Biking Association ("IMBA") which are documented in the book "Trail Solutions" ISBN 0-9755023-0-1. These standards for trail construction and maintenance have now been adopted by the NSW NPWS for its own Works Manual for track development.

In brief, it is recognised that rather than track users causing erosion, the real problem is management of storm water. Hence the IMBA Standards dictate maximum uphill grades of 10 degrees and incorporate numerous techniques to ensure that water is dispersed off the track so that erosion does not arise. Further examples include techniques such as incorporating an uphill pinch just before a tight corner so that riders wash off speed with the need for hard braking.

Conduct of the Enduro over the last 9 years demonstrates that erosion has not been an issue.

The tracks have been developed in consultation with the Bega Local Aboriginal Land Council and more particularly, Environmental studies conducted by a private consultant for the Bundadung tracks and by NPWS in relation to the tracks in Bournda National Park prior to construction reveal that environmental issues are minimal.

Two environmental factors in particular might lead to postponement or cancellation of the Event.

In 2014 a week of torrential rain meant that we postponed the Event from April to the June Long weekend.

Other factors which are most likely to result in the Event being postponed might be Extreme Fire Danger, or very high winds which might bring trees down over the tracks. The local RFS brigade is involved in the management of the Event.

COVID Management

A COVID Management Plan will be implemented in accordance with Cycling Australia requirements and as required by Councils Local Approval Policy. A register of all persons at the event hub will be kept, all participants will be required to maintain the required physical separation of 1.5 metres.

Rubbish management.

Rubbish generated at the Event Hub is management in accordance with the Country Club's usual facilities.

The Conditions of Entry and the written and oral Rider's Briefings remind riders that our tracks are largely located on private and public lands and littering is frowned upon. Riders are advised to carry empty gel packets on their jersey pocket or leg of their knicks and dispose of them at drink stations. Further, the Club arranges riders to ride the various tracks the next day and collect any litter found. To date this strategy has been successful with virtually no litter found after each of the Events in the last 9 years. The mountain biking community understands that our use of land is totally dependent on doing the right thing by landowners.

Competitor Briefing and Conditions of Entry

Tathra Mountain Bike Club promotes this event as a smoke free event.

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

1. Event Hub (Event HQ)

Event Hub (Event HQ) Location

The event hub is located at the Tathra Country Club – one kilometre north of Tathra on the Tathra Bermagui Road. Tathra is 2hrs south of Batemans Bay. Travel time from Sydney is approximately 6 hours. Travel time from Canberra is approximately 2.5 hours.

Start Locations

- All events at the Tathra MTB Enduro start from The Tathra Country Club Oval, and finish in the same location.

Registration

Registration for all events is at the Event Hub at the Tathra Country Club.

Sponsor tents, coffee & food vans, BBQ, first aid and toilets are all at the Event Hub.

Toilets are located within The Tathra Country Club – which will be open from 6am on Sunday.

2. Parking

Parking is limited at the Tathra Country Club. If you can, please ride or carpool with others to get from your accommodation to the start. The Tathra Country Club is only 1km from Tathra and accessed by road and by multi-purpose bike and walking path.

NOTE: The Country Club Oval will be closed to car entry and exit to allow for the safe passage of the 75km racers, 50km and 25km riders. However, there is additional parking available at The Quarry (located 100m south of the Country Club Oval – follow the signs), at Mogareeka (on the north and south of Hancock's Bridge) or on the Tathra Bermagui Road.

3. Registration and Entry

Entries

Early bird entries to the Tathra MTB Enduro close on the Sunday one week prior to the event. From Monday one week before the event, entry fees to King Nelba 75km, Mitas 50km and Tuff 25km will increase by \$30/ event.

Online entries close on the Friday before the event. Any on the day entries will attract an additional late fee of \$20.

NB: Riders entering the Lap-It-Up events will not be charged extra after the close of early bird entries, or a late fee for on-the-day entries, to encourage participation.

Event Registration Location

Registration for all events is at the Event Hub at the Tathra Country Club

Event Registration Times

Registration for the Bega Cheese Children's Chase will take place on the Country Club Oval between 12-1.30pm. Registration and on day entry for the Lap-It-Up events is between 12 – 1.30pm at the Country Club.

Registration for the Bundadung Tuff 25km, Mitas 50km and King Nelba 75km will take place at Tathra Country Club on the Saturday of the event, between 1PM and 5PM.

Late registration for the 75km will take place on the Sunday of the event at the Tathra Country Club between 7.15AM and 7.45AM.

Late registration for the Mitas 50km will take place on the Sunday of the event at the Tathra Country Club between 7.15AM and 8.30AM.

Please try to register on Saturday as there is limited time on Sunday morning to register. Any registration changes must be done on Saturday. **You will not be able to make any changes on the Sunday morning.**

Event Registration

All entrants must present a current MTBA License at registration. Annual licenses are available at www.mtba.asn.au If you have recently purchased a MTBA License & not yet received your card please bring proof of purchase to registration. Day licenses, valid for the whole event are available at registration. The cost is \$25.

Unfortunately, if you forget your card – you will be charged \$25 – as we do **not** have the ability to check registration details on the day.

At registration you will receive:

- **1 x Race Number:** This must be secured to the front of your bike with the zip ties provided.
- **1 x Registration pack** with sponsor and event partner information

You must hand in your signed indemnity form at registration. There is a copy for you to print out at the end of this document. You can have someone else register for you but they must bring an indemnity form signed by you.

Refunds & Cancellations

Full refunds will be paid up to 14 days of the event.

50% refunds will be paid up to 7 days of the event.

There will be no refunds within 7 days of the event.

If the event is cancelled, you can elect to:

- a) Transfer your entry to the 2021 Tathra MTB Enduro
- b) Receive a full of your entry fee.
- c) Donate your entry fee to the cause – This year funds from the event will go to local community organisations, and further develop and maintain mountain trails in the town.

4. Lap-It-Up and Children's Race Schedule

You can enter the Lap-It-Up **on the day** at the Tathra Country Club. NO LATE FEE APPLIES. So get your family and friends and have a warm up for the main event on Sunday. An MTBA day licence is also required. The course is a fun 4.5km loop starting and finishing at The Tathra Country Club Oval. It uses a mix of single track and fire roads that are also used in the 50km and 75km events.

People who have already pre-entered the Lap-It-Up events still need to come to Event Hub to register and collect their Race Number.

5. Start Times for 75k, 50k and 25k

You must be lined up at the start 15 minutes before the start for the compulsory pre-race briefing. There will be a short pre-race briefing before the start time of each of the 25km, 50km and 75km events.

These three races involve a mass start. We would ask competitors to self seed, with the fast competitors at the front and the slower riders at the rear of the start grid.

6. The courses

The race courses for the King Nelba 75km, Mitas 50km, Tuff 25km and Lap-It-Up 10 and 20km assume riders have previous mountain bike riding experience on single trail and fire roads. The courses are designed to challenge, but remain fun.

ALL course routes will be clearly marked with markers.

Lap-It-Up events

These are mass start lap events. They start and finish at the Tathra Country Club. The 5km course is one lap, the 10km event will consist of two laps, and the 20km, four laps.

The races will be staged on the single track at Tathra, with some fire road. This race does not go out onto the main road or forest trails. It starts and finishes at the event hub at the Tathra Country Club. The single trail is not technically difficult, but does involve numerous hill climbs – and special descents.

Anyone can enter. You can book in advance or enter on the day. No Late fee applies for these events.

If you enter the Lap-It-Up event and wish to compete again on Sunday, you WILL need a new numberplate for the Sunday race.

Bega Cheese Children's Chase 1km and 3km Race

This race is open to all children under 14 years of age.

There will be two courses. For young children there is a one lap ride on flat track around the Tathra Country Club Oval and surrounding trails.

For older more skilled riders there is a 3km event that involves a single track hill climb and descent.

For both events the emphasis is on participation and enjoyment. Entry is **FREE**, but all children **MUST** register prior to the race on the day. No Late Fee applies.

Racing starts 1.30pm. All children to receive a gift for participation.

The Tuff 25km - You need your stamina and a bit of pluck for this 25km jaunt.

The race starts the Tathra Country Club. To break up the crowd, you're going for a quick reccie on tar and fire roads over to Ford's Farm. **ROAD RULES APPLY HERE! You will be sharing the road with traffic.**

Once back at the race HQ the course heads through lower Poo Ponds and up the Evil-est Climb, then it's Hatti Gaddi, Nizentite, Little Dickie, Nelba's Soft Sally and sailing home via Anchor's Away.

This event **DOES NOT** include the BRIDGES or venture over to the Fireshed.

Watch out for marshals directing you at two cross over points – where you go a different direction to the 75km riders.

The event has a mix of road, fire trail and single trail and is suited to those new to mountain bike riding, and those who haven't quite got the fitness to tackle the 50km event.

The Mitas 50km (Sunday) - is a single track lover's dream – with a course featuring plenty of new twists, turns and super single track.

It starts and finishes at the event hub at the Tathra Country Club.

Eighty per cent of the 2016 course is single track. The Bridges are in! – And there's heaps of the fun, flowing trail.

The course requires riders to be fit and have previous single track experience.

You won't need oxygen for altitude sickness, but there is still some climbing to be done. It's those sneaky little climbs, that all add up.....to about 1000m of the vertical stuff.

The race starts the Tathra Country Club. To break up the crowd, you're going for a quick reccie on tar and fire roads over to Ford's Farm. **ROAD RULES APPLY HERE! You will be sharing the road with traffic.**

Once back at the race HQ the course heads through lower Poo Ponds and up the Evil-est Climb. The Bridges are back – but early in the race – when your energy is at its max.

After completing a full dose of the Bundadung, the event then heads over for a taste of Tathra fast Fire shed single trail, and a fast blast almost into Boulder Bay, before touring the picturesque, White Rock area. There's plenty of new trail you won't have seen before!!

But save some energy for the Poo Ponds finale as you hoot down Anchor's Away to the finish.

There are two other road crossings – where you will be required to stop and give way to traffic – and the earlier starting stints on the tar.

It can be disorientating in the bush. Amazingly riders in 50km event will never be further than 5km from Tathra.

Fastest riders should complete the course in: 2hours20mins

Riders should carry their own food and water.

Drink stations are located at the 28km and 45km mark. (For riders wishing to leave their own food and drinks - These drink stations are located at Tathra Rural Fire Service Shed on the Tathra Bega Rd at the top of the Tathra Township).

The King Nelba 75km

It will consist of one-and-a-half laps of the Mitas 50km course.

This means you complete the full 50km course, come back through transition at the Tathra Country Club, before heading out to complete a second lap of the Bundadung. You **will not be** racing a second lap of the fire shed.

Instead, at the road crossing you will be redirected to the hub.

This race requires a **high level** of fitness and previous single track experience.

Fastest riders should complete the course in: 3hours45 minutes. **Drink stations are located at 28km, 45km.**

If you wish to leave drink bottles and food at the drink stations, their locations are at 28km (Fireshed**) 45km (Tathra Country Club event hub).

** (Located at Tathra Rural Fire Shed on the Tathra Bega Rd at the top of the Tathra Township).

NB: ALL COURSES ARE SUBJECT TO CHANGE WITHOUT NOTICE DUE TO WEATHER AND TRAIL CONDITIONS

A STRAVA MAP OF ALL COURSES HAVE BEEN POSTED ON THE EVENT WEBSITE

Course Maps

Maps of the course will be posted on the event website. You are advised to print these out. There will be maps on display at the Event Hub near the registration area. The course is well marked with tape and arrows. The course is marked with a combination of **bunting** tape and black on white, or red on white arrows and crosses. At all intersections there will be an arrow indicating the direction to travel followed by two pieces of confirmation pink flagging tape hung a short distance along the correct route. There will also be pink flagging tape at intervals on the route if there are no junctions. There will also be flouro marking paint on the ground when appropriate. There are regular distance signs. Make sure to keep a look out for the course markers. There are plenty of markers but if you don't pay attention you could go off the course.

Feed Stations

For the 75km King Nelba there are three drink stations; Two are located at 28km and 45km at Tathra Rural Fire Shed on the Tathra Bega Rd at the top of the Tathra Township; and at the 50km mark (Tathra Country Club).

There will be a combination of water & Energy drink, at each of these feed stations. There will also be some fruit. You should NOT rely solely on the feed stations. Bring your own food and hydration as well.

Mitas 50km - Drink stations are located at the 28km and 45km mark. (For riders wishing to leave their own food and drinks - These drink stations are located at Tathra Rural Fire Service Shed on the Tathra Bega Rd at the top of the Tathra Township). There will be a combination of water & Energy drink and fruit, at each of these feed stations. You should NOT rely solely on the feed stations. Bring your own food and hydration as well.

Basic first aid, and rubbish bins are available at each feed station.

Recommended Equipment

We recommend you carry the following items:

- Pump or CO₂ canister(s)
- Spare tube(s) or patches
- Chain breaker tool
- Spare chain quick links
- Lube
- Food and drink
- Sunscreen
- Mobile phone with the event Emergency Phone number and Operations Manager phone number saved (see Section 7)

Note that we will not run a taxi service to collect you if you simply have a flat tyre or a broken chain.

Cut-off Times

The aim is to have everyone back at the finish by 3pm. This means that there will be cut-off times at the following distances:

King Nelba 75km

At 50km: 12.30pm. Any 75km rider arriving at the 50km mark after this time will be required to stop. If stopped you will be at the event hub.

Emergency Vehicles. If an injured rider has to be evacuated, an emergency vehicle may have to move through the bush to conduct the evacuation. The Emergency Vehicle will have hazard lights and headlights on at all times. Riders should slow down to let the vehicle pass if required – or stop where directed by marshals.

Rubbish

Please do not throw your gel / bar wrapper or other rubbish on the course or around Tathra. There are bins at each of the feed stations. Shove your wrappers in your pockets or up your knicks until you get to the next feed station. Do not litter the forest. Some of the tracks we will be using are in National Park, State Forest and others are on private property so let's make sure we can return!

Mosquitoes

Sometimes there are vicious mosquitoes at Tathra after wet and warmer weather. Come prepared with repellent just in case.

7. Event Safety

Stay in Control

This is a long event and contains single track as well as fire roads. There are technical sections and some fast downhill. Make sure you ride within your ability and that you are always in control: we don't want any injuries! Get off and walk if you need to. The trail can vary very quickly from smooth and fast to rough, rocky, rutted short steep mounds with narrow trees in the landing zone and sharp corners. There are water bars on some of the steep descents to control water run-off. Take care when negotiating these. No one water bar is shaped the same. Take it easy, especially when you can't see very far ahead on downhill sections.

Road Safety

You will be racing on a combination of council dirt roads, forest roads and single track. These roads are **not** closed to other traffic so please ride on the left hand side of roads. Be aware and give way to trail bikes and cars. Be careful at all road crossings. **Obey** the road rules and any direction of traffic marshals.

The tracks in the National Parks could well have pedestrians. Be careful.

Refuge Areas and Evacuation Routes

Refuge areas are areas that are safe for groups to congregate in the case of bushfires or very strong winds. They are areas that have no ground fuel or tree cover for at least a 30m radius. The danger of bushfires is obvious however this year there should be no fire danger due to the recent rains. The danger of very strong winds is that large branches and even whole trees can fall down. The event can't be held in strong winds due to this very real danger. If wind conditions became dangerous during the event, course marshals would stop you at the next Refuge Area until it is either safe to continue or safe enough to follow an evacuation route or main dirt road out of the forest.

First Aid

A professional First Aid group will be providing first aid at the start, the feed stations and the finish. They will also provide mobile first aid services throughout the course. In addition, there is roaming first aid provided by local first aiders on MTB bikes. Please make way for these bikes if they come through the course.

If you pass an injured rider on the course, please stop to help them and report any incidents to the next marshal you see on the course. We will adjust your time accordingly at the finish so please keep track of the time you spend stopped. A team of sweepers will follow the last riders through the course. They will provide assistance to anyone in need, and divert riders home, should they miss the cut off times.

Emergency Instructions

In case of an incident please follow these steps. To report an incident you should attempt to make contact via step 1. If this is not successful move to step 2 and work your way through accordingly.

Minor Incidents: sprains, fatigue, non-urgent incidents and general reporting if you have safety concerns about the course.

1. Report to the next feed station or the next course marshal if you can't make the feed station. Non-urgent evacuations will be made from feed stations. Evacuations will be done when there are available resources.
2. Call HQ emergency mobile (see below). This phone is manned by the event First Aid Coordinator. This phone number will also be printed on your number plate.
3. Text HQ emergency mobile
4. Call or text event Operations Manager (see below)

Major Incidents: broken bones, snake bites, severe bleeding, heat exhaustion, hypothermia etc. Please immediately report any bush fire that you can see or smell to Event HQ (Operations Manager).

1. You or another cyclist needs to provide the first response and injury management.

2. Call 000. If your phone doesn't have reception try 112 which works with all phone providers. Call HQ emergency mobile (see below). This phone is manned by the event First Aid Coordinator
3. Text HQ emergency mobile.
4. Call or text event Operations Manager (see below)
5. If you can't get through on any of the numbers below call '000' or 112 which will use any available mobile network. You must tell them you are participating in the Tathra MTB Enduro at Tathra.

Phone Reception

There is mobile phone coverage over some of the course. Reception goes in and out frequently over the whole course as you go onto ridges and down into gullies. Note that there is reception in Tathra but unfortunately, only with Telstra. We encourage all riders to carry a mobile phone on the course. If you need to make an emergency call and do not have reception just continue on the course uphill until the reception improves.

In case of emergencies ride to the next drink station or marshal.

Withdrawing from the Event

If you need to withdraw from the event for any reason at all, you must report to the timing marshals at the event Hub. You need to tell the timing marshals that you have withdrawn from the event. This is extremely important for the safety operation of the event. Do not ride through the finish arch but instead go directly to the timing marshals who will be located beside the finish arch.

Insurance

MTBA insurance covers you for injury. However, we recommend that you have your own personal accident insurance and ambulance cover.

Warning

Please ensure that you are sufficiently skilled to undertake the event. The course is a combination of single track, fire road and a small amount of bitumen road. Some sections of the course are technical and there are some short tricky downhill sections. Ride within your limits and get off the bike and walk if you need to. Please ensure that you are fit enough to complete the event. It is a very physically demanding course with lots of steep climbs. Ensure that you are in good health and that you do not have any illness that will hinder your ability to complete the event. Make sure you keep well hydrated during the event and take some food and water with you.

8. Competitor Services

Food

The Event Hub will open from Saturday afternoon.

On Sunday, there will be a fundraising BBQ by Lions from 7am. There will also be a coffee van. The Tathra Country Club offers Chinese lunches and has a bar for the purchase of soft drinks. There are also numerous cafés and lunch spots at Tathra.

Bike Repairs and shop

There will not be a mechanic Service at the Event Hub! However if you have forgotten to bring something? Tathra beach & Bike' located 1km from the Event Hub has a good range of range of accessories, spare parts, tyres, tubes, helmets, clothing, shoes, gloves, sunnies, etc. The maintenance team and shop will be available all weekend.

First Aid

A professional First Aid team will be based at the Event Hub on Saturday and Sunday to provide any first aid you might require.

9. Race Results & T-Shirts

Provisional race results will be posted on the website by Monday morning. If you have any queries about the results please email us as soon as you can so we can address any issues before posting final results.

Limited edition Tathra MTB Enduro T.Shirts (in male and female sizing) will be available for pre-purchase at entry or at the event registration and on race day.

These groovy and irreverent mementos are designed by Cycology's Sarina Tomchin, with all proceeds towards Tathra bike path maintenance.

At \$25 they are an absolute steal.

10. Event Rules

- Outside assistance is not permitted. This is a self-supported race.
- No littering
- You must wear an Australian standard cycling helmet.
- Your race number must be visible on the front of your bike at all times.
- Report to the finish timing marshals if you withdraw from the event but **DO NOT TRAVEL THROUGH THE FINISH ARCH.**
- Stay on the marked course. Short cuts are not permitted. If you get lost return to the last sighted race sign.
- Give way to emergency vehicles (cars and trail bikes) if they come through the course.
- You must obey directions of marshals if you miss any time cut-offs and at the road crossing. You could be disqualified.
- Please assist riders on the course that have been badly injured and are in need of help. Pass on information to the next rider to notify marshals. Your time will be adjusted to account for time lost in providing help so keep track of the time you lose.
- Passing: those riders wanting to pass should yell "track left" to pass on the left or "track right" to pass on the right and wait for a safe place to pass. Please be considerate of other riders. Dangerous manoeuvres can result in disqualification.
- You must obey all road rules.
- You must hand in a signed indemnity form at registration. You should have read and understood the indemnity form.

11. Presentation and Prizes

In 2021 – the Random prize draws will take place during the event. All winners will be posted on the event notice board. After your race – PLEASE CHECK IF YOU ARE A WINNER and show some ID to collect your prize.

The MAIN presentation the 25km, 50k and 75 will be at 2pm on the Sunday afternoon. All prizes will be awarded at the presentation. Prizes will be awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd place getters in each category. **However there must be five entrants in each category before prizes will be awarded.**

There are also lots of special or spot prizes to be given away. If you are called up for a prize for placings or spot prizes, you or a representative needs to be present to collect the prize. Prizes will not be posted out after the event.

CHAIN OF RESPONSIBILITY

1. **Steve Todd...**.....**Race Director**....(Long range Radio) Headquarter No Will liaise with Emergency Services re major injuries. Consult with Tathra Rural Fire Service in relation to potential Fire risk. Make decision as to whether race will proceed.
2. **Konrad Reardon...**.....**Medical Director**... track/rover/first-aid co-ordinator.....(Long range Radio). Roving in 4WD vehicle with spinal board, oxy-viva and other major first aid items. This vehicle will evacuate injured riders outside the race area to meet ambulance. Supervise evacuation in the event that an injury requires a person to be carried to ambulance access point.

Arrange qualified first aider to manage First Aid Room.

3. **Richard Lane.....**.....**Hub layout coordinator**. Fence off specific parking and access for Ambulance and RFS.
4. **Rik Moran...**.....**Track Director and Roving First Aid Sweep rider coordinator**. (UHF channel 20. Phone....). Maintain radio contacts with Sweep Riders to facilitate evacuation of race area if required. E.g. In the event of a bush fire.

d) Tathra RFS Shed
e) other Locations determined by Medical Director depending on circumstances. Sweep riders to assist at critical points to direct Ambulance to point near accident site.
4. **RFS and Ambulance dedicated parking.** Tathra Beach Country Club. As per hub layout.

Safest Tracks to evacuate uninsured riders from track area:- (All dependant on time of day). E.g. Mechanical problem or general evacuation such as bushfire.

- a) Thompsons Fire Trail – East of Lewy's Loop and exit at Panorama Drive.
- b) Thompsons Fire Trail – West of Evil Tom entry and exit on Thompsons Road
- c) Old Tip Road area. Exit at Panorama Drive or Fauna Place.
- d) White Rock Road – Exit at Girls Memorial (Evans Hill) opposite Kianny Cabins entry

GENERAL EVACUATION ASSEMBLY POINTS

Track Supervisor to arrange deployment of personnel to designated points to intercept riders and direct evacuation by most efficient / safe route. (Locations of designated points determined by progress of Event).

- a) Tathra Fire Shed. Riders to then proceed by road to the Country Club for sign off.
- b) Tathra Country Club.

FIRE RISK

Tathra and Tarraganda Rural Fire Service Brigades available for consultation both days. Both Brigades in attendance on the Sunday.

CROWD MANAGEMENT PROCEDURES.

- a) Entry and Exit from the Country Club to have suitable barriers supervised to enable safe passage of both riders and spectators.
- b) Country Club parking area adjacent to the oval closed 30 minutes before first Race start.
- c) Suitable spectator points will be designated on materials displayed at the Event Hub.

ROLES FOR SWEEP RIDERS.

- ☐ 8.30am 75 km start....Andy Johnson to sweep through /Fords and Bundadung. Hand over sweep job to Derek Van Bracht/Mark Fowler /John Murphy at Fire Shed road crossing. Approx 9.45am.
- ☐ Return to Country Club for 12 noon 25 km start.....sweep/circulate for entire race.
- ☐ Tom Park & Adam Machan 10am 50 km start....sweep through Fords and Bundadung. Hand over sweep job to Derek Van Bracht /Mark Fowler / John Murphy at Fire Shed road crossing. Approx 11.15 am.

- ☐ Tom to locate last 75 km and sweep back to Country Club and beyond.
- ☐ After diverting, Adam locate last 50 km and sweep to Country club.
- ☐ MARK FOWLER/JOHN MURPHY.....(2 LONG RANGE RADIOS AND ONE SHORT RANGE)
- ☐ Ride Fireshed loop at 8.30am and check bunting and look for campers and vehicles driving around.
- ☐ Approx. 9.45am watch 75 km entering Fireshed, then take over sweep from road crossing.
- ☐ Approx. 11.15am watch 50 km entering Fireshed, then take sweep from road crossing.
- ☐ Each sweep rider to carry a phone preprogrammed with the phone numbers of the Race Director and Medical Director.
- ☐ Each sweep rider will have a radio, so keep in touch and warn others of approaching first/last riders. All RFS vehicles will also be on channel 20, so if assistance is needed, just call. A base UHF radio and battery chargers and spare radios are available in the Fireshed if radios start to lose power.
- ☐ ON road, one person must always stay with the last rider of each category (75,50,25) The other circulates within the riders (usually back half). Stay in touch with each other. On Track just circulate and locate leader and follow last rider.
- ☐ Locate and commence first aid on any injured rider.....assess the need of ambulance, evacuation or some TLC. Contact Race Director, ambulance, in case of assistance needed.
- ☐ Help riders with minor mechanicals and if unable to fix, instruct rider of safest and quickest route out of the race area. NEVER SEND THEM BACK ALONG A TRACK WHERE ON-COMING RIDERS WILL BE! Instruct riders to present at the Race Hub for sign off to avoid subsequent search!
- ☐ Remove branches, loss rocks, fix bunting and maintain general track safety upon noticing any issue.
- ☐ Contact Andy Johnson [REDACTED] for chainsaw or major track repair.
- ☐ Inform volunteers and drink station people when the last rider passes through.

RURAL FIRE SERVICE Cat 9 and Tarraganda 7 to proceed as directed.

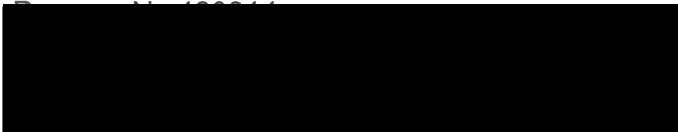

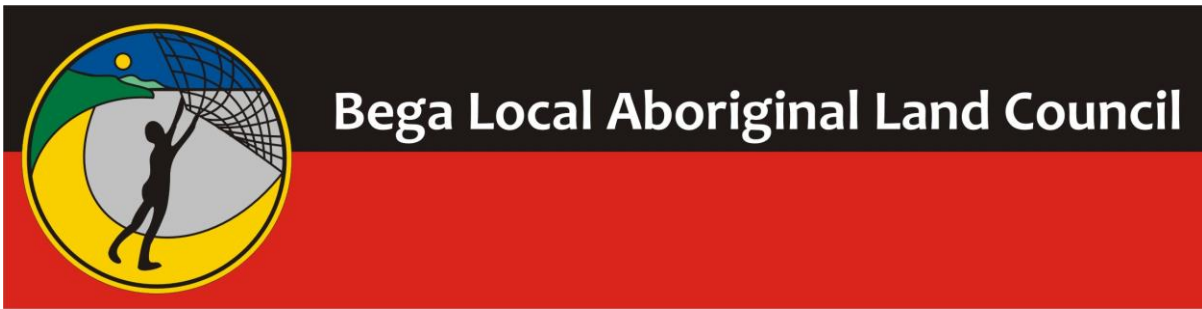

Dear Paul,

I am writing in response to the correspondence received from you on behalf of the Tathra Mountain Bike Club (TMB Club) in relation to Bega LALC owned land; namely Lot 2881/DP 1246666 (email and attached correspondence dated 7/12/2020).

At a recent Bega LALC board meeting, the board considered the request for consent to hold the Tathra Enduro event in June 2021 on the land detailed above. We understand that consent from land owners/manager is a requirement for applying for the required authorisations to hold the event.

The Bega LALC acknowledges the good work done by the Tathra MTB Club and local community in holding the Enduro event and the benefits that have flowed consequently.

The Bega LALC gives consent for the event to be held on this land in June 2021 subject to the conditions detailed below.

Conditions:

- Correspondence is provided to the Bega LALC stating that the Tathra MTB Club is solely responsible for providing the general required building and maintenance of the track sections that are present on Bega LALC land; and specifically to meet the requirements for safely holding the event.
- Correspondence is provided to the Bega LALC stating that the Tathra MTB Club indemnifies the Bega LALC in the event of any claim associated with activity on these tracks.

- If an incident occurs in the absence of risk warning signs at track entrances the responsibility is borne by Tathra MTB Club.

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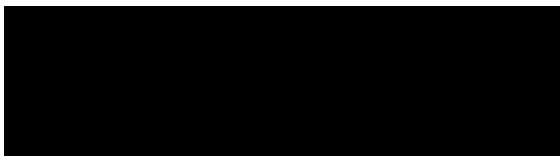
