# 4.1. Risk Management and Workplace Health & Safety for Committees

## 4.2 Policy & Procedure

Tarraganda Hall advised that in Council's Operational Plan for this year the Hall Committee Guidelines will be updated and the Facility Management Plans for each hall will be reviewed.

There is an overall Council Buildings Asset Management Plan which is under review. The Facility Management Plans for each hall will be developed over the year in consultation with the hall committee. Hall Committee Guidelines will be raised as an agenda item at the next meeting to discuss changes.

# 5. Business Arising

#### 5.1 BVSC venue hire website/communications (Emily Harrison/Judy Martin)

Council more broadly is looking to make changes to the BVSC website to improve the content on the website and landing page and reshaping this information so that it is an easier experience for the customer. Project should be completed by early next year.

#### **Community Hall website improvements**

For community halls it would be good to have a main page and list all the different uses. This would include halls that are suitable for music venues and then the customer can refer to that hall's page for further information. Might need to present the information in a different way.

The hall committees should start to think about what information they would you like on their hall web pages, including ideas from other websites that they like.

There is an option to add a Google calendar on the hall web page to show if the hall is already booked. It can appear so that no private details are shown.

Additional photos would also be beneficial including the spaces for hire and photos of the space being used. It will sell the hall visually so that people can see the space and how their function can look. If people are in the photos, they must be either not identifiable or you have their permission.

Bemboka Hall raised the issue that the halls do not have the acoustic capability for music events. May need to investigate creative arts grants to activate the space. High curtains along wall can work but acoustic tiles are better.

Murrah Hall has a quote for acoustic panels set off the walls. Acoustic improvements are not only for music but can also keep school children much calmer when they use the halls.

Action: Council officer to provide a hard copy of what is currently on the Council website for each community hall and distribute before the next meeting. This will enable the hall committees to workshop some ideas and suggested changes and assist with putting together a list of information of what they would like included on the webpage.

#### New volunteers to join hall committees

Communications can advertise for community volunteers to join hall committees via channels such as Council news, Facebook (3,000 subscribers), media releases and social media reminders to raise the profile of local community halls. Perhaps feature a particular hall from time to time. Each community hall is unique and a valuable resource. There is also an option to advertise community functions via BVSC local events calendar. People may travel to other areas to attend an event. Could also be good to investigate some local connections, such as the school P&C or regular users of the hall.

Wyndham Hall commented that it is not obvious that community halls are run by community volunteers on the BVSC website. That is something that could be improved.

**Action:** Hall committees to provide Council the key things that help to attract new volunteers. Provide a story on why you contribute as a volunteer in this way and how that is a rewarding experience. This will generate more interest in the community.

#### 6.2 Timber Pest Inspections

Bega Valley Pest Control will be commencing timber pest inspections soon. They have been provided contact numbers for access, please ensure access is provided for all locked rooms within the hall.

Please also let a Council officer know if you detect any rodent evidence in the hall. Bega Valley Pest Control can include this treatment with pest inspections.

#### 6.3 Origin - new gas supplier

Council have arranged a new contract with Origin to supply gas. Elgas did not put in a tender for this contract. There is a change over and transition period before the contract commences and some defects need to be rectified.

Action: Council Officer to advise applicable hall committees with the new Origin gas arrangements.
