1 Welcome and apologies

2 Confirmation of minutes

That the minutes of the previous AIAC meeting held on 11 May 2020 and 13 July 2020 be taken as read. Motion moved by Rosemary Oates and seconded by Colin Dunn. Unanimously adopted.

3 Presentations to the Committee

Bega Valley Shire Council – Zingel Place Redesign – Presented by Daniel Djikic

Daniel Djikic presented to the Committee the draft redesign proposal for the Zingel Place Administration Office. The project encapsulates a Bega Valley Regional Gallery (BVRG) upgrade and Zingel Place Administration Upgrade. Currently progressing with the design of the new Gallery with the funding secured through the Building Better Regions Grants round. The Zingel Place Administration Upgrade is currently not funded.

The current building was built in 1988 so does not suit the current standards for accessibility. Construction of the redesign to AS1428 and accessibility specifications. Engaged a BCA consultant. Looking to increase the customer experience to the Zingel Place Administration Building and BVRG. Upgrade the office spaces to make them more accessible, user friendly and usable.

Timeframes:

BVRG Redesign has been adopted by Council and funded. Request for Tender expected to be advertised in January 2021.

Zingel Place Administration Upgrade in concept design phase and will be going to Council in December 2020.

Mr Finneran asked about the slope of the concrete entrance to the Zingel Place Building. Mr Djikic informed the Committee that the changes to the entrance concrete slopes are not in the current scope of the project and will remain the same.

Ms Gates expressed interest in being involved in the stakeholder working group for the redesign project.

New Action: Daniel Djikic to liaise with Felicity Gates regarding vision impairment accessibility aspects and invite along to stakeholder working group meetings.

5 New and other Business

5.1 Access & Inclusion Advisory Committee Update requests

No updates requested.

5.2 Sub Committees reports and updates

Tourism Access – Sapphire Coast Proposal (Attachment 1)

Mr Dunn discussed the Tourism Access – Sapphire Coast Proposal that recommends a collaboration with Destination Marketing to promote the access brand and increase its profile. Businesses could promote their accessible accommodation options through the consistent use of an icon and accurate web-based information. This would make it easy for those with accessibility issues to easily find the suitable accommodation.

Main points of discussion were:

- The first part of the proposal is underway.
- There is no current funding allocated to the project.
- Accessibility now has a higher profile the for Destination Marketing organisation.

The Sub-Committee would like to seek funding to engage a consultant about approaching businesses to assist them with implementing the e-information on their websites to assist promotion of not only their business but the whole Sapphire Coast is an accessible tourism destination.

Ms Robb added that there is opportunity to apply for grants through mediums such as Strengthening Rural Communities grant. There is a requirement to substantiate the scope of work. It could be a scaled project focussing on 25 businesses first ranging from Bermagui to Eden. The Sub-Committee are seeking endorsement to move forward to the FRRR funding.

Ms Oates spoke her experience with assessing accessibility to pharmacies noting that some businesses are 'stuck in their ways'. Ms Gates has asked whether anyone has taken DDA legal action against the Bermagui Pharmacy. No action understood to be undertaken as yet.

Dr Howe suggested the AIAC Committee could move to use the excess funding from the Access Improvement Grants 2020 round to allocate to the Sapphire Coast Destination Marketing or to allocate to a capital works project.

Motion:

That the Access and Inclusion Advisory Committee:

- 1) Write to Southern Coast Destination Marketing to thank it for its support to promote accessible tourism on its website
- 2) Seek grant funding for further work to promote accessible tourism within the Shire
- 3) Delegate Mr Dunn and Ms Robb to work on a grant application, with support from Council

Moved Ms Robb.

New Action: Ms Robb and Mr Dunn to work with Council's Grant Officer to write a grant funding submission for the implementation of the Sapphire Coast Accessible Tourism Proposal including the employment of an individual to consult with businesses about accessibility issues. Ms Robb and Mr Dunn to engage with Council regarding statistics of accessible tourism locations that are Council owned to support the grant application.

New Action: Chair to write to Sapphire Coast Destination NSW and congratulate them for their work so far pulling together the landing pages for promoting accessibility.

Tourism

Ms Robb updated the Committee on the accessible platform and access to Boyd's Tower. Mr Finneran and Ms Robb met with Andrew Wall – Area Manager for National Parks about two years ago. The National Parks and Wildlife Service has engaged an architect commencing this week.

Accessibility - Business

Mr Finneran and Mr Dunn met with the Sam Watson, Project Engineer at Bega Valley Shire Council at the Eden Port. Limited opportunity to improve accessibility given the steep gradient of the site. There are alternative route to get from the top to bottom of Eden port. Mr Dunn congratulated Mr Watson on the job addressing their concerns as best as possible. It was mentioned that the quality of the disabled car park at the museum isn't encouraging. Result of poor guidance and supervision of the materials used for the completion of the disabled car park.

New Action: Follow up on the grant that was awarded to the Killer Whale Museum to it ensure that it was built to the correct standard.

5.7 Update on the Disability Inclusion Action Plan

Ms Cleverley updated the Committee on the status of the Disability Inclusion Action Plan. Noting that it continues through the consultation phase with two key themes emerging:

- a. The need for training and awareness raising about inclusion and its benefits for Council staff and the community
- b. The opportunity provided by an accessible and inclusive tourism strategy. Once the consultation (internal and external) is complete this month the possible actions will undergo a ranking process (based on the frequency and importance of the issue each action is responding to) and then a prioritising process will occur (how the issue links with other commitments and investments by Council and the community.)

Once the DIAP is fully drafted a final review of the actions and measures will occur and Councillors and the AIAC will have an opportunity for final input.

Many thanks to the AIAC for its engagement and interest on the Disability Inclusion Action Plan.
