New local art prize set to launch

An exciting new art prize specifically for artists living and working in the Bega Valley has been launched.

The Bega Valley Mural Prize represents the evolution of the Bega Art Prize that has run in differing forms since 1992, with the support of the Bega Valley Shire Council.

The prize is open to artists working across all mediums, including 2D, 3D and photographic, and will result in two successful artists receiving cash prizes of \$500 and having their works reproduced on a large scale and presented as public murals on Bega Valley Shire Council water tanks in Bermagui and Bemboka before Christmas.

This will add to the two murals already in situ at Eden and Merimbula.

The Director of the Bega Valley Regional Gallery, Iain Dawson said,

Council responds to Bermagui tree concerns

Bega Valley Shire Council has been working with members of the Bermagui community around addressing safety concerns with a number of aging trees in the vicinity of the town's surf club and outdoor gym.

Five trees in that popular area were assessed in June by a qualified arborist:


- It was recommended that two of these trees should be removed due to extensive decay within the major limbs and previous failures.
- It was decided that another three trees should be pruned to reduce weight and remove deadwood
- The community were notified on August 28, which immediately prompted a need to review plans and consideration of new ideas.

As members of this community, Council appreciates and understands the value of trees, and the connection many people have with particular trees. Staff look to balance that with our requirement to manage safety in public places.

In this case, Council will slow our progress in order to meet with members of the community and further develop alternative ideas on how to manage the recreational needs of this area and, specifically, how to manage these trees.

Creating garden space under the trees in order to limit public access, moving furniture and infrastructure where we can, and adjustments to car parking arrangements are all being considered.

It may be possible to retain these two trees, but at the same time we need to accept that trees have a lifespan and our challenge is to manage their natural decline in public parkland.

DA top marks for Bega Valley

An independent review of the Shire's Development Assessment Service has found that Council is providing service levels well above the average of its peer councils.

Of particular note was the professionalism and helpfulness of staff, which was described as particularly high.

A number of recommendations in the review will drive further improvement in Council's service, some of which have already been actioned.

The work ahead includes the creation of a specialised customer focussed Development Hub, improvements to the information available on Council's website, and fine tuning electronic document management.

Attracting and supporting high quality development is critical for the Shire, and continuing to improve our application process is an important part of that.

Bermi's new bike path

A positive result for members of the Bermagui community, with a new bike path constructed opposite Bermagui Primary School.

Improved safety and access for children and families who walk and ride to school is a key outcome.

To improve safety further, Council commenced work this week on a refuge island on Lamont Street (near Wattle Street), providing a safer location to cross.

Bega Valley water remains safe

Council is concerned and frustrated at media reports insinuating the community is being exposed to "deadly bugs" in the Shire's drinking water.

Residents can remain confident that our drinking water is of high quality, consistently complies with the

Australian Drinking Water Quality Guidelines (2016) and remains absolutely safe to drink.

The ABC report falsely cited four boil water alerts on the Bemboka River Catchment in ten years as evidence of "repeated contamination incidents" triggering "potential health risks".

The facts are that a boil water notice was issued for the Bemboka and Bega-Tathra Water Supplies (March 2010) following flooding rains as a precautionary measure due to highly turbid water; while three precautionary boil water notices (January 2016, June 2016 and March 2017) for the Brogo-Bermagui Water Supply were issued on the advice of NSW Health in response to elevated turbidity in the Brogo River following catchment rainfall.

Council's Water & Sewer Manager, Jim Collins, said "There have been no water-borne disease outbreaks attributed to BVSC drinking water supplies at any time during their long-term operation over many decades."

"Water quality monitoring evidence shows that drinking water quality in the Bega Valley Shire is of a high standard due to the high quality of local source waters and catchment health, well operated disinfection systems and sound management, maintenance and monitoring of drinking water supplies."

Mr Collins said water filtration plants would strengthen the Shire's systems and that Council is hoping to work with the NSW Government to achieve that.
