Your say on sportsgrounds

Council is calling for community help to build masterplans that guide the future use and development of two regionally significant sportsgrounds: the Pambula Sports Complex and the Bega Recreation Ground. The masterplans will be designed to fit the current and identified future needs of the community through consultation with user groups, the community and other key stakeholders. There are opportunities for the community to have their say, primarily through community workshops. Anyone with an interest in their local sportsground is welcome to come and have their say, including residents and business owners, existing and potential users of the facilities.

Workshop participants will be encouraged to draw their ideas, write notes or provide comments directly to a large paper plan of the sportsgrounds. A word from Waste

Our new Organics Waste Project Officer, Mick Jarochowicz, has begun working his magic on mulch which, in the coming months, will undergo extensive testing and development to bring it up to Australian Standards.

This means cleaner, better mulch for our residents with the correct amounts of all the good stuff to make your garden grow. In the meantime, there is still mulch available at Merimbula, Eden, Bermagui and Wallagoot transfer stations. For a limited time, mulch is still free for residents and the \$3 loading fee still applies. Soon, mulch will be priced at \$15 per cubic metre, with no loading charge.

Our new mulch will contain fewer contaminants (remember to watch what you put in your green bin) and more essential nutrients, so stay tuned for more info.

More blood needed

The Australian Red Cross Mobile Blood Service will visit Bega, from Monday 3 August to Friday 7 August and there are appointment times available each day so more donors are needed.

If you haven't already made an appointment to give blood you can phone 13 14 95. One in three Australians will need blood, but only one in 30 donates. Donated blood helps cancer patients, people with blood disorders, mothers-tobe and newborn babies, as well as trauma and surgical patients.

Household chemicals

A reminder that Council's household chemical collection is on again this year, starting at the Merimbola St Carpark in Pambula on Saturday 25 July from 8am to 2.30pm and at the Bega Saleyards in Kerrisons Lane on Sunday 26 July from 8am to 2.30pm. The Bermagui collection will be held at Dickinson Park in Lamont Street on Saturday 17 October from 8am to 2.30pm.
